### Lateral Flow Testing

From this week, all St Alban's staff will have access to Lateral Flow Testing. This is another measure in place to try and minimise the transmission of Covid-19 in school and it will serve as a way to identify asymptomatic staff. Staff will take tests bi-weekly and should a test come back positive, we will follow Public Health England's guidance and inform parents and carers that it would affect. Hopefully, this is another step towards us returning to school in full.

## Remote Learning Achievements

The children have adapted exceptionally well to remote learning since the National Lockdown begun and we all wanted to say how proud we are of them for this. The learning that is being sent in to teachers is of fantastic quality and children are trying hard to include all of their prior skills whilst keeping their standards of handwriting high.

It is fantastic to see so many faces on the daily live registrations sessions and the live reading sessions: please continue to join as a way to keep a sense of normality for our children during these strange times. All of the staff at school are dearly missing having a full class of children in their classroom, so it is almost bringing a sense of normality to them too.

#### Exercise Books

If children are coming to the end of their exercise books and would like some more, please can parents/carers inform the class teachers so that we can organise collection of new ones. We ask that the completed books are returned to school for us to keep as evidence.

#### Contact and Communication with Families

It is imperative that we can contact out families that are not in school on at least a weekly basis during National Lockdown. Teachers will attempt to call between Monday and Wednesday and will call numerous times if they are unable to get through. If they cannot get in contact, this will be passed on to the Senior Leadership Team or our Family Support Worker. This is very important so that we know if there is anything else we can be doing to support our families during this time. If you have recently changed your numbers, please ensure the school office have the most up to date contacts.
