I can publish a reconstruction of a narrative

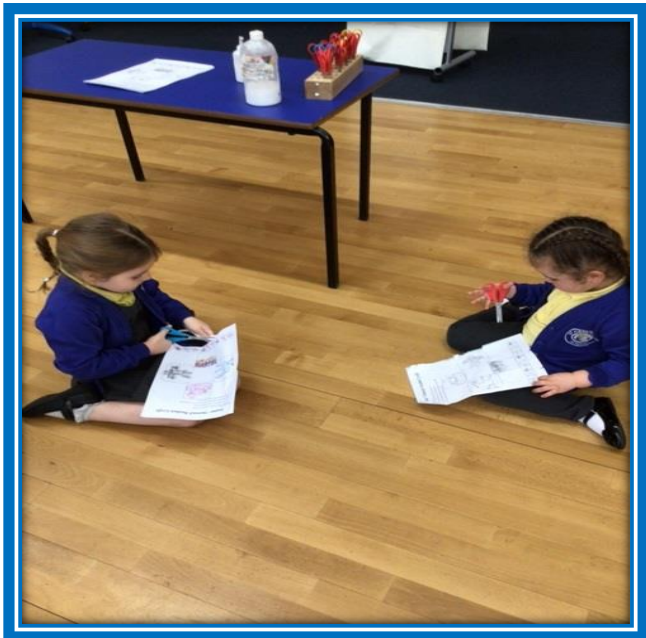
Walking through the streets of London the Shadowman could not describe
