

Nursey: This week Ajooni has been showing our perseverance value by learning to write her name. She is becoming very independent in her name writing!







Reception: The children have been designing and creating rockets during enhanced provision this week. They have made some amazing designs!




Year 2: Lana is beginning to use sources of evidence to identify the impact that the Great Fire of London had.




Year 1: Philip has been selected for his determination to improve his letter formation.


Year 4: Taylor has persevered with his maths work when using the column method to add.
